
## Williamston, Town with a Legacy

In the Fall of 1842, West Allen Williams, a prominent landowner, discovered a mineral spring on his property. As news of the spring's medicinal value spread, a town grew, and Williamston became a major resort.

The Civil War brought an end to Williamston's "golden era" but not without lending a bit of history to the town. The last skirmish east of the Mississippi was fought in Williamston township on May 1, 1865.

In 1871, the Williamston Female College was founded offering educational opportunities to girls. As the college grew, it was moved to its present location in Greenwood and named Lander College in honor of its founder, Dr. Samuel Lander.

Today, Williamston thrives again. The spring still bubbles in Mineral Spring Park in the land West Allen Williams deeded to the town. The people of Williamston are reminded of the town's legacy through two events each year—the Spring Water Festival in August and the Christmas Park in December.
